

The Ocean Sunfish

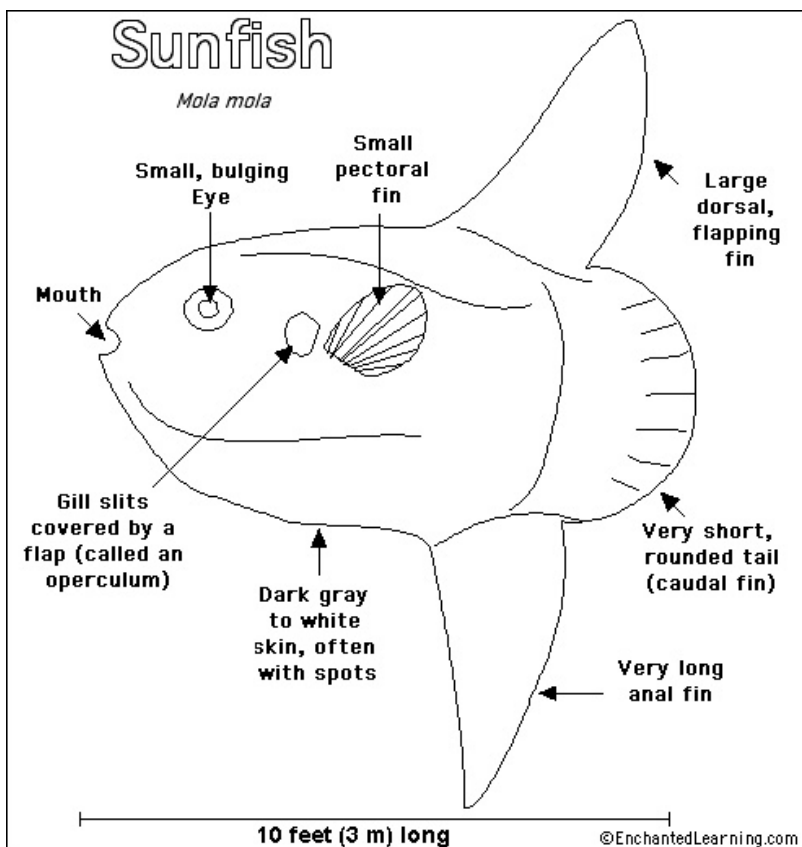

This is a diagram of an Ocean Sunfish.



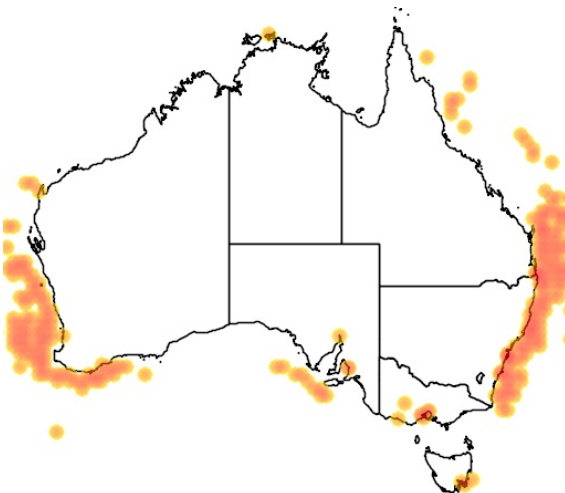
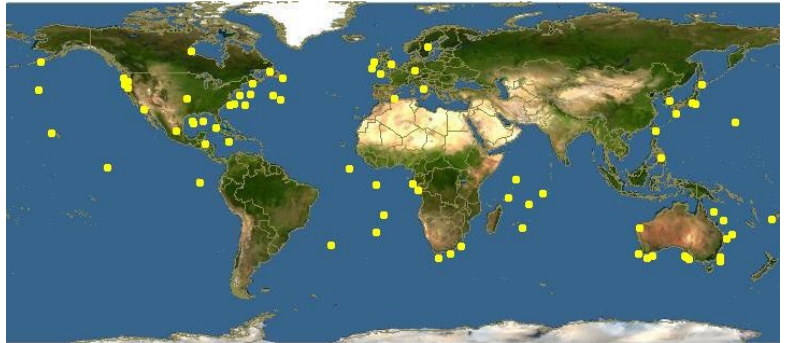
Sunfish weigh approx.
